

# Role of Co-Executive Secretaries and Designated Federal Officer

#### **Co-Executive Secretaries**

- Schedule and approve all PAGAC meetings
- Make logistical arrangements for PAGAC public meetings, including subcommittee meetings
- Prepare and approve all meeting agendas in consultation with the Committee Co-Chairs

#### **Designated Federal Officer (DFO)**

- Attends all meetings of the full Committee and work groups/subcommittees (or DFO representative)
- Initiates and adjourns full Committee meetings

### Subcommittee Structure and Support

- Subcommittee leads
  - PAGAC member will lead each subcommittee
- Subcommittee liaisons (federal staff)
  - Primary communicator between subcommittee and DFO/Co-Executive Secretaries
- PAGAC member support
  - Admin, post-doc, or graduate students can support the work of subcommittees through note taking, meeting scheduling, etc.
- Consultants (if requested)
  - Must be vetted before working with a subcommittee
- Outside experts (if requested)
  - Can give presentations to subcommittee or full PAGAC (can be a federal employee or non-federal employee)











## Additional Subcommittee Support

- Federal Support Staff
  - Assists with subcommittees, public meeting support, travel, website, public comments, etc.
- Science writer
  - Supports development and editing of Scientific Advisory Report
- Literature review team
  - ICF International staff member will be assigned to each subcommittee
- Data analysis
  - CDC or NIH staff, when data requested











#### PAGAC to PAGAC Communication

- Co-Executive Secretary for subcommittee should be copied on all correspondence
  - FACA requirement for government record
- Committee members cannot hold meetings without the DFO or designee present
- Refrain from e-mailing the entire Committee
  - Deliberations of entire Committee must be in a public forum
  - Documents available to all PAGAC members must be made available to public on request


